TIME TO SAY ADIOS

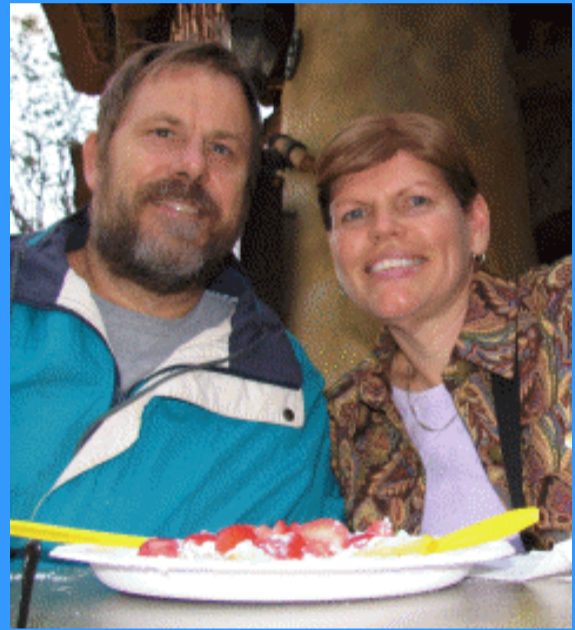
What an incredible year this has been! We have traveled nearly 45,000 miles by car, and just as many by air. We have made new friends, and been reacquainted with friends from the past.
